CSRA Information Update:

NEW ISR & CSRA RULE CHANGES FOR 2011/2012 RACE SEASON

In regards to the recent CSRA annual drivers meeting on May 7 and the ISR Snocross rules meeting May 15. The following represents new rules and class changes that will be implemented at CSRA events this coming race season.

120cc Classes:

The stock 120cc class (12 mph.) is now restricted to kids 4-7 years of age.

VINTAGE RACING:

No change.

NOVICE CLASSES:

CSRA and ISR will introduce a new Novice racing class specifically for a de-tuned Arctic Cat SP500. At CSRA events our current Novice 1 class will be changed to accommodate this new race class.

CSRA NOVICE 1- 2012:

The new Novice 1 Arctic Cat SP500 race class is designated for kids aged 8-9-10 years of age.

The Arctic Cat Racing department will offer a selected number of SP500s available at discounted pricing. (If you are interested contact Mike Kloety: MKloety@arcticcatinc.com). To compete in the new CSRA Novice 1 class, the stock Arctic Cat SP500 will need to have a detune kit that will make the performance of the sled similar to a Ski-doo Freestyle 300. The kit will be available at selected Arctic Cat dealers or through the Arctic Cat Racing department. The detune kit will include the following.

- *New throttle cable to permit the use of the 600cc race sled throttle lever.*
- *New handle bar wire harness to allow a new style kill switch.*
- *New slide style kill switch similar to the 600 race sled..*
- *Aluminum throttle lever adjustment for small hands.*
- *Hardware kit needed for installation.*
- *50% percent throttle kit and re-program of ECU to lower engine RPM.*
- *Stock Skis and the Stock track must be used. Traction products are not permitted.*
- *SP500 comes with FOX Zero Pro rebuildable gas shocks that can be fine tuned per rider*

CSRA NOVICE 2 & NOVICE GIRLS:

At CSRA events the Arctic Cat SP500 will now be permitted to race in the Novice 2 class with the 0-600cc Fan sleds. This class is designated for kids 10-13 years of age.

The Arctic Cat SP500 must be equipped with a Throttle Block to compete in this class. ECU modification is not required. Traction products are permitted.

CSRA NOVICE 250cc

The Novice 205cc class is designated for 0-250cc 4-Stroke snowmobiles specifically the new Phantom 250.

This class is designated for kids 8-13 years of age. CPI Recreational Products will sell the new Phantom 250cc sled to CSRA members that race at a minimum of (4) races at a discounted price of \$3756.00. A optional race kit will also be available.

CPI Recreational Products will sponsor this class with the following prizes.

1st. Place overall high points winner of the 250cc class will receive a \$5000 educational bond.
2nd. Place overall will a new Phantom sled.

All other CSRA Novice classes remain the same as last season.

CSRA JUNIOR F1:

At CSRA events the Arctic Cat SP500 will now be permitted to race in the Junior F1 class with the 0-600cc Fan sleds. This class is designated for Junior racers 13-17 years of age.

The Arctic Cat SP500 must be equipped with a Throttle Block to compete in this class.

Junior racers that have placed first in a Junior 1 or Junior 2 class are not permitted to race in the Junior F1 class as this class is designated for inexperienced Junior racers.

Studs are not permitted in the Junior F1 class.

The Junior F2 class will be eliminated,

All other Junior classes remain the same as last season.

CSRA TRAIL SPORT CLASSES:

No Changes.

CSRA SPORT CLASSES:

Sport 500: At CSRA events, all 600cc stock race sleds with ISR approved throttle limiters will now be permitted to race in the Sport 500 class.

Sport 600: Will be allocated points at Regional and National events in 2012.

All other Sport classes remain the same as last season.

CSRA & ISR SEMI-PRO NAME CHANGE:

CSRA & ISR Semi-Pro classes will now be called Pro Lite.

At CSRA events, we will feature a Pro Lite Stock class on Saturdays and a Pro Lite Open class on Sundays. Only the name is changed, otherwise the classes are the same as last season.

An additional \$1000 per weekend will be added to the Pro Lite division. (\$500 each class).

PRO OPEN:

No changes, The Pro Open class will race to finals both Saturday and Sunday each weekend.

SPORT & SEMI-PRO RACERS:

Sport and Semi-Pro Racer's that finished the race season in 1st., 2nd., or 3rd., overall during the 2011 race season are placed on notice that they are being requested to move up to the next higher race division this race season.

Racers that prefer not to move up this year, may appeal to the CSRA race director with a letter requesting a one year hold back period and the reason's to justify the hold back.

TRACTION PRODUCTS:

Enhanced stud backer plates are now permitted.

Studs must be trail type, commercially available carbide tipped studs with a minimum 3/16 shoulder adjacent to the carbide tip. All studs and backer plates must meet ISR specifications.

At CSRA events, Studs are not permitted in any 120cc class, Novice 250, Novice A, Novice B, Novice 1, or Junior F1.

WARM UP STANDS:

At the ISR rules meeting there was concern regarding inadequate warm up stands. Warm up stands must be a solid construction and must be designed to retain any debris or traction products.

HELMETS & TETHER CORDS:

It is now a ISR rule that the tether cord must be attached to the racer or crew member at all times when the engine on a race sled is running.

As well, it is mandatory that all racers and all minors, where a helmet when a race sled is in motion on a race course or in the pit or parking areas.
